



Summary of Indoor Residual Spraying in The Gambia

AFM summarized indoor residual spraying (IRS) activities occurring in African countries based primarily on reports from the World Health Organization (WHO), Global Fund and the President's Malaria Initiative (PMI). Little information was available from other sources. AFM hopes IRS activities will be sustained and expanded as appropriate, and that all donor agencies supporting IRS with public funds will make available detailed and accurate reports in the future. Below is the summary of IRS activities in The Gambia.

The Gambia was awarded two Global Fund malaria grants: a Round 3 grant in 2004 and a Round 6 grant in 2007. Neither of the Original Proposals requested funding for IRS. According to the Round 3 Original Proposal, vector control activities including larviciding, residual spraying and fogging are limited because of high cost and insufficient funding.
